

At Gateway, each member is seen as a valued participant, someone who has something to contribute to the rest of the group regardless of their disability. The Clubhouse engages members in every aspect of its operation. The skills, talents, and creative ideas of each member are needed and encouraged. Participation is voluntary, but each member is encouraged to participate in work each day. The relationships that evolve through this work together are the key ingredient in Clubhouse rehabilitation.

# Helpful Guidelines for a Gateway Clubhouse Referral

## Gateway Can Assist With:

- Soft Work Skills
- Social Skills
- Wellness
- Advocacy
- Community Integration
- Independent Living Skills
- Engagement in Meaningful Work

## Qualifications:

- At least 18 years old
- Have a brain injury diagnosis
- Independent in activities of daily living (if not: attendance with a personal care attendant, a non-Clubhouse employee, is required)
- Free of behaviors that would pose a threat to other Clubhouse members or the community

## Funding:

- TBI survivors can apply for funding through Alliance Behavioral Health
- Acquired brain injury survivors may be eligible for scholarship services, otherwise private pay

## Tours:

- Tuesday or Thursday at 9:30am
- Tours last approximately 25 minutes
- Referral is not necessary to schedule a tour
- Tours are provided by a staff and Clubhouse member

## Member Interview:

- Prospective members will next schedule an interview with the Clubhouse members
- Scheduling is flexible

## Orientation:

- After member-approval, orientation is scheduled on a Tuesday or Thursday from 2p-3:30p
- Referral needed for TBI survivors
- Person Centered Plan (PCP) is created and paperwork completed.
